Hello Fellow Pool Members,

I tend to be a "list" guy and just out of habit I make more lists than I know what to do with, so...with that being said, and now that the summer is officially over and our beautiful pool is closed for the winter months, I wanted to take a look back at our time together this past season.

What went right:

- We had no major injures of broken bones or worse. Keeping our members and guests safe is top priority of the CPM Lifeguards and our Pool Committee and I'm happy to say it was a success this year.
- We were open for the maximum # of days this summer. We did not have to close the pool for an extended amount of time due to a non-weather factor. There was 100+ days we could be open and we were open for 100+ days. Now if only Mother Nature would cooperate a bit more for us during those times.....
- We had a fun and successful Swim Team season with 2 home and 3 away meets and we improved overall from last year in City Meet. I would like to take a moment and Thank the Swim Team Committee lead by Char Edwards for making sure all of our children had another fun year representing the High Point Elks at the various practices and Swim meets. Also thanks to ALL the Volunteers (and it takes a small Army) who helped us this season. Our home meets are run very efficiently and we get many compliments from the guest teams on how well it is run.
- Our bathrooms had fewer issues this year as compared to the past. There was some piping that was replaced in mid to late summer of 2017 and that seemed to be a big help this year. The problems didn't go away entirely (and honestly they never will with 40+ year old pipes) but the bathrooms were operational often this summer and when we did have to shut them down they weren't down for long.
- Speaking of the bathrooms—how about those bathroom floors!! We had them grinded down and a special coating put on which gave them grip and they definitely held their "look" all summer. No more paint peeling up after the first weekend of being open. Being one of the guys who painted those floors each spring I can assure you that this was a wonderful and needed improvement to our pool area.
- We had great turn outs for the multiple events held at the pool such as Opening/Memorial day weekend, SOS (Schools out for summer), 4th of July, Band night under the shelter, various cookouts, Guest Fee Free day, Labor day weekend, and more. Thanks to everyone who came out to enjoy the pool and support the lodge.
- Our shelter was very popular this summer and was rented out on a consistent basis. This is a great way to have a party or function in "a sun and fun atmosphere", while letting friends enjoy the pool and all we have to offer--for a great price.

- We had our first (that I recall anyways) "guest fee free day" and we saw a lot of new faces on that day in August !! Thanks to everyone who came out and brought friends or family to it. The weather was a plus that day and it was such a success that the Pool Committee is now considering making it an annual event.
- The diving boards were freshly coated and an "Elks" logo was put on the bottom of each. They look terrific and should last us many more years.
- We also were able to get 6 new "Elk Blue" umbrellas this year. These are very durable and make the pool deck look great. Donations from our fantastic ladies auxiliary, an Elk family and the work of your Pool Committee is how we were able to obtain these. Thanks to all of them !!

Some things that didn't go exactly as planned:

- Mother Nature rained out some of our Friday nights and weekend or two at the least. More than once she dumped so much rain on us that we had flooding into the bathroom walk in areas as well as the guardroom.
- The bees this summer were a cause of concern. We did what we could to keep them away, but the fact is we are outside and therefore susceptible to situations like this. Most of the bees were honeybees and not aggressive, but they liked to hang out near the handrails around the pool (mainly near the deep end) for some reason. Unfortunately, with the kids also being very active around these same areas we had some stings—usually from the bees being stepped on accidentally. We will be looking into our options if this still an issue going into next summer, but keeping people aware of the bees may be our best option.
- The diving boards mentioned above were also very slippery at the start of the season something none of us saw happening after we had them stripped down and re-coated. We reapplied the same "grip" coating we used on the boards in years past, but for whatever reason the boards were proving difficult at times and we have several people slip while attempting a dive. We even shut the boards down for a few days at the start of the summer to reassess them. All of our members were very understanding of the "safety first" approach and we had the boards back up and running within a few days. As the season went on they seemed to have less and less problems as they got more and more use. Hopefully that will continue into 2019.

Some other items I'd like to mention that were done: #Poolfairies

- The previously mentioned bathroom floors—we are hoping it will be at least 7-10 years before we have to look into re-coating them again.
- New bathroom floors meant we those lockers needed a facelift...and they got it !!! all new paint for the lockers had them looking good and ready for use !

- We did some "preventative maintenance" and had the pool pump serviced this year to make it running like new. You may not know this but that pump stays on 24 hours a day, 7 days a week for the summer. So its running non-stop the 100+ days while the pool is open for our members and about 2-3 weeks before and after the season as well. It is the heart of the pool and we want to keep it around for a long time. Hopefully we won't have to get it serviced again for another 2 years at least.
- There was a metal pipe in the pump room that leaked badly when the pump was not running, and it was decided to replace that before the pool season started. The plan is over time to replace all the metal piping, and this was basically the first step.
- There is a law that states pool drain covers need to be replaced every 5 years or the pool won't pass inspection. Next April would have been year 5 for our current drain covers and with the Board of Directors approval we had CPM come in and replace them at the end of this season and file the paperwork with appropriate NC State department. This way we have already taken care of an important item and possible obstacle before the opening of next year.

Some possible...and I stress POSSIBLE items we are looking at for the future:

- New Roof on the pool house. The current one is very old and not looking very good and needs to be replaced sooner than later. This will be a topic of discussion for the PC during the offseason.
- New hot water heater for the pool showers. The one we have only has to work 100 days out of the year, but it gets quite a work out during those 100 days. It is way past its prime and we keep squeezing one more year out of it. We may get one more year or we may not. We will be prepared either way.
- 4-6 new tables. We know we have some tables that are in bad shape out there and we want to replace them as soon as we can. This items is definitely on the radar for next season.
- 5 new blue umbrellas will give each and every table we have (23 total) its own umbrella and a uniform look across our pool deck. These umbrellas are the best we have ever had, and don't fade. We have been buying these in sets of 6 for 3 years now...and I personally can't tell by looking at them which ones we bought 3 years ago and have had over 300 days in the sun versus the ones we got this year.
- I mentioned the flooding when it rained hard in the bathroom walkways and the guard room earlier. We are going to try and do our best to figure out and fix (if possible) the drainage around the pool house building. If we can get that improved hopefully the indoor flooding will end.


ANTLERS IN THE COMMUNITY
