Saturday's business meeting was very informative with reports from all of our state committees. There were also several special awards presented to members around the state for their quick response to hurricane Florence victims.



16th Annual HP Elks Chili Cook-Off Saturday, November 17th

1. Eligibility: At least one team member must be an Elks Lodge Member in good standing. Each team may have up to 6 members. The registration fee for each team is \$20 per category OR for \$50 you can do 3 (or more) categories. Each team member will receive a free drink coupon. All team members must be at least 21 years of age.

2. Entry Requirements: A completed entry form and the registration fee must be turned in to the Bar or Lodge Office <u>no later than Sunday, November 11th</u>. Make all checks payable to High Point Elks Lodge #1155. Each team is required to make at least 1 gallon of Salsa and/or 2 gallons of each Chili and/or 2 racks of Ribs. Each team must have a theme and a name for their entries.

3. **Time Schedules**: Teams may begin to set up equipment, decorations, etc. any time after 2pm on Friday, November 16th. Please have your area set up by 9am Saturday morning. <u>The Team Captains meeting will be held at 9am</u> on the morning of the cook-off. All teams may begin preparing their Salsa and/or Chili and/or Ribs immediately following the Team Captains meeting.

4. Chili Rules: All Chili must be cooked on site the day of the cook-off from scratch. No ingredients may be pre-cooked or treated prior to the preparation period. The only exceptions are canned tomatoes, tomato paste, peppers, pepper sauce, beverages, or broth. Meat may be precut ground or chopped, but not treated or marinated. All other ingredients must be prepared on site during the preparation period. No commercial prepackaged chili mixes are permitted.

Chicken or Turkey may be pre-cooked for sanitary reasons. Chili must cook for a minimum of 3 hours. Teams may provide cheese, crackers, cornbread, peppers, etc. to serve with the Chili.

5. **Ribs Rules**: All Ribs must be cooked on site the day of the cook-off. No ingredients may be pre-cooked or treated prior to the preparation period.

All cooking and preparation must be out in the open and in a sanitary manner. Failure to comply will result in disqualification. Each team will provide all the ingredients, utensils, water, and accessories necessary to cook their chili. No electric power is available for cooking so please bring your own cook stoves and fuel.

The Lodge will provide a banquet table for each team, tasting cups for the public, and containers for the judging samples.

Teams may enter any or all divisions. Blind judging will apply to all entries.

Salsa Division: Prepare your favorite homemade Salsa and serve it with chips for this division.

Texas Division Chili: Texas Chili may not contain beans, rice, or fillers of any kind. Meat should be ground or finely chopped, hamburger grind is discouraged.

Open Division Chili: The open division Chili is more like every day chili. This Chili may include beans, vegetables, pasta, rice, etc.

White Division Chili: The White Chili division is for teams who want to prepare their chili with chicken, turkey, pork, sausage, etc. Nothing red is allowed.

Ribs Division: Any type of ribs will qualify.

Judging: Each team will be assigned a team number by the Chief Scorekeeper and will be will be given a container in which the Salsa, Chili or Ribs will be collected at the time of official judging. Make sure the container has your team number on it. The Team Captain is responsible for delivering the Salsa, Chili, or Rib samples prior to judging times.

Our Food Judges will be judging the Salsa, Chili and Ribs simply by which one tastes the best. There are no special guidelines to the judging. THE DECISIONS OF THE CHIEF JUDGE SHALL BE FINAL.

Showmanship Competition: Showmanship will be judged on your cooking site, theme, costume, action, and audience appeal. Judging will be on a continuous basis throughout the day by the attendees.

The winning team in each category will receive a champion's certificate and a \$100 Elks gift card.

RULES:


- 1. Eligible participants must be Students enrolled in the 5th, 6th, 7th or 8th grade at the time of the contest.
- 2. Essay length is not to exceed 300 words.
- 3. Essay must be typed or legibly printed in ink. Also, Essay must be submitted as written (or typed) *by the entrant*.
- **4.** Essay must be submitted for judging to the Elks Lodge nearest to the address of the entrant.
- 5. Participant must be identified by name, grade, school attending and sponsoring Elks Lodge on the Essay.

AWARDS:

Plaques will be awarded by the Grand Lodge for 1st, 2nd, and 3rd Place for national winning essays in Division I and Division II. Winners will be announced at the Grand Lodge Session in St. Louis, Missouri, June 30–July 3, 2019.

ENTRY DATE:

Essay should be submitted to local Elks Lodge on/before December 15, 2018. The Essay Contest Cover Sheet must be completed for each level of competition and remain attached to the Essay.









AMERICANISM ESSAY CONTEST

Essay Theme: "What Makes You Proud of America"

- 1. Eligible participants must be a student enrolled in the fifth, sixth, seventh or eighth grade during the normal 2018-19 school year, preceding June 30, 2019. Deadline: Must be submitted to Local Lodge by December 15, 2018.
- 2. Essay length is not to exceed 300 words.
- 3. Essay must be typed or legibly printed in ink. Also, Essay must be submitted as written (or typed) <u>by the entrant</u>.
- 4. Essay must be submitted for judging to the Elks Lodge administering the contest at his or her school or, if unknown, to Lodge nearest to home address of entrant.
- 5. Entrant must be identified on essay by name, home address, grade, school attended and sponsoring Lodge. (Lodge may enter Lodge information on essay.)
- 6. Judging criteria:

Originality: Avoid the use of trite or worn out words and phrases – 30 points Development of theme: Stay focused on ideas and thoughts. Don't ramble – 40 points Mechanics and neatness: Use proper spelling, grammar and punctuation – 30 points

There are two divisions for judging essays: Division 1 (combined fifth and sixth grades) Division 2 (combined seventh and eighth grades)

PROCEDURES FOR LODGE AMERICANISM CHAIRMAN

Select from submitted entries the top three essays from each division and send the six essays to the District Americanism Chairman by Jan. 31, 2019, or the date established by the State Association.

PROCEDURES FOR DISTRICT AMERICANISM CHAIRMAN

Select the top three essays in each division from entries submitted by Local Lodges and send the six essays to the State Americanism Chairman by Feb. 28, 2019, or the date established by the State Association.

PROCEDURES FOR STATE AMERICANISM CHAIRMAN

Select the first-, second- and third-place winners for the state from entries submitted by the District Chairman. In addition, State Chairman forwards the first-place winners from each division to the Grand Lodge Essay Contest Administrator. (*Must be postmarked by March 31, 2019.*)

SEND TO: Essay Contest Administrator David P. Cioe, Grand Lodge Fraternal Committee, 6 Francis Street, Barrington, RI 02806-2709.

Plaques for first-, second-, and third-place winning essays in Divisions I and II will be presented to the home Lodge of the winners at the Grand Lodge Session in St. Louis, MO, June 30-July 3, 2019.
