
# wheel of karaoke

#### The Long Hall

A disciplined, orderly life was second nature to Steven Hall. He served in the U.S. Army for 35 years, including two tours to Afghanistan. And when he returned home, he continued protecting his community in North Carolina as a police officer for 30 years. A year after sending his son, Tucker, to college, the life Steven had created descended into unfamiliar territory for him and his family when he was diagnosed with a fast-moving cancer.



"When I started my first semester after my father's passing, I realized I had lost more than just a parent," Tucker shares. "I lost my life coach, my mentor, and the person who was supposed to teach me how to be the best version of myself."

After more than 25 years as a member of High Point, N.C., Lodge No. 1155, Steven formed lifelong friendships with his Elks family. Even while battling cancer, Steven continued to serve as the Lodge's Exalted Ruler and was joined by his friend of more than 40 years, Britt Moore, who became the Lodge's Lecturing Knight.

"Tucker's father and I shared a special bond." Britt shares. "He was a special man and friend."

While battling cancer, Steven continued making plans for his family. He asked fellow Elks to make sure Tucker received information about the Elks National Foundation's Emergency Educational Grant, offered to the children of deceased or totally disabled Elks. Steven's wish that his family be taken care of was answered. After Steven's passing, Tucker received the scholarship, continuing his education at East Carolina University where he is pursuing a degree in business, specializing in finance.

"As Elks members do, they have looked after our family and delivered on their promise," says Jenni, Tucker's mother.

Before receiving the scholarship, the stress of paying for college and helping his mother pay their bills weighed heavily on Tucker. His father had always worked hard to make his family comfortable, and Tucker tried to do the same by keeping the illusion that his family's lives "were not just completely flipped upside down." The EEG lifted the Halls' anguish.

"By taking the stress away from my mother and myself to pay for college, I can focus on me," Tucker shares. "Hopefully, one day, I'll be able to pay it all back to the people and organizations that got me here."





Like he did in high school, Tucker continues to excel in his studies and is involved with many extracurricular activities, including playing intramural football and disc golf, and coaching intramural softball. He's working hard to fill the shoes his father left for their family.

"In addition to handling his responsibilities at college, Tucker has stepped up to the role of 'man of the family' to help take care of his mom after his father passed," Moore says.

By joining the Order, Steven knew his family would never be left behind and Tucker will never be alone because they'll always have their Elks family.

In 2018-19, the Elks National Foundation allocated \$323,890 to fund the Emergency Educational Grant program for children of deceased or totally disabled Elks. # HIGH POINT ELKS LODGE #1155 ANNUAL ANDY ALBERTSON & STEVEN HALL MEMORIAL GOLF TOURNAMENT

The High Point Elks Lodge #1155 will be hosting their annual Andy Albertson & Steven Hall Memorial Golf Tournament on Saturday, May 18th at the Oak Hollow Golf Course, 3400 North Centennial Street in High Point starting at 12pm. The entry fee is \$75 per person for a four person captain's choice team. This year's charitable funds will be given to The Steven Lindo Hall – Billy Fisher Pi Kappa Phi Criminal Justice Annual Scholarship at UNC of Charlotte. This scholarship is awarded to a community-minded student who is a Sophomore, Junior or Senior from the state of North Carolina.

Bring your own team. Singles are also welcome and will be paired with a team. The entry fee includes greens fee, cart fee and driving range balls. Hamburgers and hotdogs will be provided after tournament at the High Point Elks Lodge during the awards ceremony. Entry deadline is Friday, May 3, 2019. Each year all net proceeds are distributed to local charities, with zero funds being retained by the Lodge. Since 2014, this event has raised over \$38,000 for charitable causes including: Caring Services Vets Safety Net, Hospice of the Piedmont and Feeding Lisa's Kids.

Steven Hall was a former Exalted Ruler of the High Point Elks Lodge and civil servant to the community and the nation. Retiring after 33 years in the Army Reserves, Master Sergeant Hall served two tours in Afghanistan and earned a bronze star. He was master Greensboro police officer for 30 years and simultaneously served with PNRC where he started a basketball league with the help of UNCG's Pi Kappa Phi. He has also served as a DARE Officer in various elementary schools and as a Resource Officer in several middle and high schools.

Andy Albertson, also a former Exalted Ruler of the High Point Elks Lodge, passed away during his term in 2014. This annual charity event was initially established as a tribute to his service to community, devotion to the Elks and to his fellow man.
