# From the Deep End

Hello Fellow Elks,

As I'm writing this we are a solid month into our pool season and the hottest days of summer are almost upon us. A great way to beat the heat is to spend some time at your Lodge's pool! I wanted to mention some of the benefits and rules of being a Pool member at our lodge. ## Some benefits of being a pool member:

- ⋆ Our Pool season is over 100 days long!
- ★ Our pool was completely resurfaced in 2016—it's like new!
- \* Separate fenced in baby pool area; the baby pool itself is for children that are 5 years old and younger only please.
- \* We have a competitive swim team that is part of the Community Swim Association (CSA)
- ★ We also have a Junior Elks swim team for those children just starting to learn how to swim
- ★ We offer Swim lessons for people of all ages
- ★ We have a Spacious Shelter (available for rent)
- The entire pool area and shelter are non-smoking
- \* We have a professional Pool Management Company to oversee the daily operations of our pool; they provide certified lifeguards and make sure the pool levels are within range for safe swimming.
- ★ We have High and low diving boards
- \* Our pool has a shallow end that is great for our smaller swimmers to enjoy and is a terrific place for adults to relax and talk to their friends
- \* We also have our deepest end that our bravest swimmers enjoy whether it be from the diving boards or even from the side of the pool
- ★ We have 23 tables with umbrellas to provide shade
- \* Numerous chaise lounge chairs (varying styles) for those who like to lay out to relax, enjoy the sun or read a good book
- ★ We have "adult only" swim for 10 minutes each hour.
- \* Our Lost and Found area for the pool is in the guard room; please check this area frequently as you enter or exit the pool

#### **HOURS:**

Now that GCS is out for the summer, our pool is open at 11am on the weekdays!!

Open Memorial Day weekend to Labor Day

Monday – Thursday (11am – 9pm)

Friday (11am – 10pm)

Saturday & Sunday (10am – 9pm)

On weekdays, when Guilford County Schools are in session, hours are 4pm - 8pm

# Frem the Deep End

## Guests:

We also welcome guests to the pool on almost all of our Pool days. Some reminders when it comes out bringing a guest:

- ★ Guest fees are \$ 10 per person (per visit)
- \* We also sell Guest passes that are 10 visits for \$80 total...these do not have to be used on the same guest or same day; Each guest and visit will have one "punch hole" on the card, and the card is expired after 10 punches or the end of the pool season (whichever is first). Please keep in mind that bringing in multiple guests on one visit will have multiple punches on the card.
- \* Guests must be signed in by the member and must leave before or when the member leaves; guests cannot stay at the pool longer than the member who signed them in.
- \* Anyone coming to enjoy the pool, pool deck or shelter (even if they are not swimming) is considered a guest and must pay the fee and adhere to the Lodge and Pool rules/policies.
- ★ The member signing in the guest is responsible for the guest while on the lodge grounds.

## Pool Shelten:

There is a fee of \$70 for a party that is 2 hours or less (\$90 for 3 hours or less) with a maximum of 20 guests (swimming and / or non-swimming). There is a fee of \$5 per person over the allotted 20 guests. Elk pool members are not counted as guests. A non-refundable deposit of \$40 is required to reserve the shelter.

- ⋆ Please contact the office for availability and reservations.
- No parties will be allowed on Saturday or Sunday until after 3pm.
- No parties are allowed on holidays.

No drinks are allowed in the pool or on the side of the pool. This is for everyone's safety. Please keep all food and drink at the tables and chair areas.

Please be courteous when playing music from a personal music device (PMD) such as Bluetooth speakers, cell phones, etc. Not only can loud music from a PMD be an annoyance, it could impede yourself or others from hearing any directions from the lifeguards in case of an emergency.

# From the Deep End

We have "adult only" swim for 10 minutes each hour. 16 and older only are allowed in the main pool during this time. (Normally 10 minutes before the start of the next hour). No one under 16 is allowed in any area of the main pool (including the shallow end) during this time.

As mentioned before, the only children allowed in the baby pool are those that are 5 and under. This includes when the main pool is on "adult only swim". Children older than 6 are not allowed in the baby pool at any time unless they are babysitting/helping with a child under 6 in the baby pool.

Please be courteous to your fellow members when it comes to saving tables and chairs.

No glass containers of any kind are allowed on the pool deck.

No outside alcohol is allowed into the Pool area. This includes shelter rentals. All alcohol must be purchased from the bar/lounge area.

The Life Guard's main priority is to ensure the safety of our members and guests. Please respect their authority and when a whistle is blown it is to ensure rules are being followed for everyone's safety.

If there is thunder in the area the pool must be cleared for 30 minutes from the last sound of thunder.

If there is lightning in the area the pool deck must be cleared (including shelter area) for 30 minutes.

The pool phone number is 336-869-2487. If you are unsure if the pool is open, please call this number. If no one answers please call back a few minutes later as the guard room may have been empty at that time.


