From the Deep End

This has been the one of the most unique Pool seasons we have ever had at High Point Elks Lodge #1155. I'd like to thank everyone for their patience and understanding as we are all adjusting to the social distancing rules and regulations. So far the "bring your own chair" change has been a big success and something we will look into partially implementing once all of this is behind us. In the meantime, we will not be using the normal pool chairs and chaise lounges until MAYBE Phase 3 or beyond. Some other topics that people have inquired about:

1. Floatation devices are allowed, but **MUST** be used in the manner they are intended. Ex: Pool noodles are ok, but if kids are hitting each other with them, or blowing water out of them at other people, those will be removed from the pool and can be picked up on the way out. Also, we request that the floatation devices are only able to hold no more than 1 person at a time. This is to help ensure the guards can see and scan the bottom of the pool as easily and often as possible. Large floats impede their vision, and therefore are not allowed. Thank you for your understanding.
2. At no time should a child wearing water wings, or anything to help them float be allowed in the deep end of the pool. Only people who can swim on their own, with no assistance, should be swimming in the deep end, or jumping/diving off either diving board.
3. The High Dive rule continues to be 8 years and older only. Please help us enforce this rule by making sure children younger than 8, regardless of how good of a swimmer they are, does not go off the High Dive. This is for everyone's safety. The Low Dive has no age requirement.
4. We have special anti-Covid19 cleaner located at the Guard Desk for members use to spray down tables or anything they feel needs to be disinfected. Please make sure to return the spray bottle to the Guard Desk when done.

I would like to thank the Pool Committee for working so hard before the season started to ensure the pool was ready to be opened under some very difficult and unprecedented conditions. These Volunteers did an amazing job and seeing the pool in full use 7 days a week makes it all worthwhile.
