





This year the tournament is benifitting the Victory Junction Gang. This is a year-round camp facility for children with serious illnesses and chronic medical conditions. Founded by Kyle Petty and his family in honor of his son Adam, Victory Junction provides life-changing camping experiences that are exciting,

fun, and empowering, in a medically safe environment, always free of charge. Victory Junction's adaptive, intentional programming includes summer camp, family weekends, day programs, and equine therapy. In addition to onsite programs, Victory Junction's Reach team takes camp experiences to children and their families at hospitals, clinics, and in Ronald McDonald Houses throughout North and South Carolina.

Andy Albertson & Steven Hall Memorial Charity Golf Tournament

This annual charity golf tournament was first started in 2014 to honor High Point Elks' Exalted Ruler Andy Albertson after his death while in office. It was established as an annual event to pay tribute to his service to community, devotion to the Elks and his fellow man.

Each year net proceeds have been donated to different non-profit charities in the area such as Caring Services of High Point, an organization that tries to provide the best possible opportunity for each individual to achieve lasting abstinence from all mood altering substances and to assist individuals in rebuilding their lives. Net proceeds have also benefitted Hospice of the Piedmont in High Point, to help provide medical, emotional and spiritual needs of their patients and families. In 2018, Feeding Lisa's Kids became a benefactor. This non-profit, started by Lisa Hawley and her team of volunteers, help feed the children and families in High Point who would otherwise go without food.

Sadly in 2019, Steven Hall was added to the memorial golf tournament. Steven died after serving as Exalted Ruler of the High Point Elks. Hall was a civil servant to the community as well as the nation. Retiring after 33 years in the Army Reserves, Master Sgt. Hall served two tours in Afghanistan and earned a bronze star. He was a Master Greensboro Police Officer for 30 years and simultaneously served with PNRC where he started a basketball league with the help of UNCG's Pi Kappa Phi. He also served as a DARE Officer in various elementary schools and Resource Officer in several middle and high schools. So in 2019, the tournament helped to set up the Steven Lindo Hall – Billy Fisher Pi Kappa Phi Criminal Justice Annual Scholarship with \$10,000 to UNC of Charlotte. This scholarship is awarded to a community-minded student who is a sophomore, junior or senior from North Carolina.

In 2020, \$12,000 was given to High Point Regional Health Foundation for Heart Strides. The Heart Strides Cardiac and Pulmonary Rehabilitation Program is designed for people who are suffering from heart and/or lung disease. Participants work toward a healthy recovery supervised by a team of skilled professionals. Through exercise, nutrition, counseling, education and behavioral modification, cardiac and pulmonary patients in our community are making great strides toward independent and healthy lifestyles. Net proceeds from the golf tournament benefitted those patients who cannot afford the cost of the Heart Strides Program.

In 2021, \$15,000 was given to The Tiny House Community Development, Inc. The THCD mission is to build tiny houses and develop tiny home communities. Their intent is to work alongside those experiencing homelessness, veterans and displaced individuals. THCD strives to encourage positive community engagement while fostering an educational experience with job site training.

Every year the tournament has strived to increase their giving with more sponsors and donations. So in 2022, the tournament was able to give The Heroes Center of High Point, \$21,000. The Heroes Center, a faith-based 501c3 non-profit, tries to provide all Veterans with the necessary resources to successfully transition into civilian life. Their goal is to address the tough issues facing Veterans such as transitional housing, job placement and the challenges of connecting in community. The organization also provides emergency and transitional housing on an 8-acre campus in High Point and connects Veterans with necessary services to address homelessness, emergency food needs, benefit assistance etc. through its collaboration with other Veteran Service Organizations (VSO's) and the statewide network of the Veteran Bridge Home.

This year, 2023, is the 10th anniversary of the tournament and our goal is \$30,000. Our benefactor is Victory Junction, a year-round camp facility, set up by Kyle Petty and family to honor his son Adam. The camp enriches the lives of children with serious illnesses by providing life-changing camping experiences that are exciting, fun and empowering, at no cost to children or their families. This is a place "where kids are the heartbeat of the camp" says President & CEO, Chad A. Coltrane.
